

Grading of Notes for MATH 1113, Fall 2009

Each set of notes will be assessed according to the following rubric:

Score	Description
4	The student's notes contain the relevant information presented in the learning experience and are organized in a way that captures the main ideas and any important supporting ideas. In addition, the format of the student's notes makes it easy to see relationship(s) among the information.
3	The student's notes contain the relevant information presented in the learning experience and are organized in a way that captures the main ideas and any important supporting ideas.
2	The student's notes are missing important information or are not organized in a way that captures the main ideas and important supporting ideas.
1	The student's notes do not contain the relevant information presented in the learning experience.
0	Not enough information to make a judgment.

The 50 points for note taking will be assigned as follows:

- 10 points for completion of notes for your assigned classes.
- 5 points for documentation on T-Square forums of contributions to at least 5 other sets of notes (if fewer than 5 sets of notes, the number of points awarded will be equal to the number of sets of notes contributed to).
- 25 points based quality of your notes, using the following guidelines.
 - 25 points: Minimum standard is all but one set of your notes scored as a 4, with no notes scored less than 2.
 - 20 points: Minimum standard is at least one 4 and at most one 2, with no notes scored less than 2.
 - 15 points: Minimum standard is all but 1 set of your notes scored as a 3 (or higher) and at most one set scored less than 2.
 - 10 points: Minimum standard is at least one set of your notes scored as a 3 (or higher) and at most one set scored less than 2.
 - 5 points: Minimum standard is all but one set of your notes scored as a 2 (or higher), with no notes scored less than 1.
 - 0 points: Does not fall into any of the above categories.
- 10 points based on the overall quality of your group's notes, determined by multiplying the average score your group's notes received by 3 and rounding to the nearest integer. (Extra credit possible here.)
